

TRI Curriculum Overview

The following schedule outlines the term, days, and week, and sometimes hour of day of that term when a TRMA course is *generally or historically* offered; schedules can change so please verify offerings at least 1 term prior to taking a course. Additional electives not listed are also offered on a yearly basis.

Most TRMA courses are blended, meeting 50% face to face (f2f) and 50% online. Hence, f2f meeting schedules will be published by the professor at the beginning of each term. Unless otherwise indicated, all courses are 1-unit seminars, meeting 9am - 5pm for f2f sessions. *If a course overlaps with a GCEP course, contact the TRMA professor. This can often be accommodated due to the blended format. With professor permission, you will be able to register despite a schedule overlap.* Yearly courses are noted in black type; bi-yearly courses are noted in green type along with the years in which it is offered. Courses with required prerequisites or other anomalies are noted in red type.

Students earning the <i>post-graduate certificate in trauma response services</i> complete a trauma-informed research project. Students may begin the project after completing TRMA 500 + 501. Meet with Anna Berardi early in your discernment process to learn how to keep the project practical and manageable while completing your TRI and degree programs. This project comprises 3 of the 12 required certificate units. Trauma Research Project Sequence: TRMA 571 (I), 572 (II), 573 (III): See the catalog for complete details. Students begin the project in fall or spring, and continue until it is complete, registering for each course in numerical order.							

- All TRMA courses are open to graduate students or post-graduate professionals in the mental health, ministerial, education, and health care disciplines.
- GSC students may use TRMA courses to fill elective reqs. TRMA courses may be double-counted as electives and to fulfill post-grad certificate requirements.
- Some Block B courses (for ex, *some* TRMA 585s; 543, 544) are profession-specific with enrollment restrictions as noted on the University course schedule.
