Spanish Major Transfer Guide 2011-2012

Students interested in the Spanish major are encouraged to complete the Associates of Arts Oregon Transfer Degree (AAOT) or the Washington Transfer Associates of Arts (WTAA). As a pre-requisite to beginning courses in the Spanish major, students must demonstrate proficiency in SPAN 202 Intermediate Spanish II by one of the following ways:

- 1) Take a placement exam showing their proficiency in the material covered by SPAN 202 (contact the Spanish department at 503.554.2670 for more information)
- 2) Provide transcript information with proof of their completion of a SPAN 202 equivalent course

For students with no previous Spanish experience, the following sequences of courses are recommended in order to gain proficiency in SPAN 202 Intermediate Spanish II through a community college:

GENERAL INFORMATION

Spanish Major:

The Spanish major offers a 39-semester-hour course of study that is designed to move students toward advanced proficiency in the four skills (reading, writing, listening, and speaking) defined by the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL). The program emphasizes the unique relationship between culture and language. Central to all course work is an examination of issues of faith and culture. In keeping with the mission of George Fox University, service components are required in some courses.

Advanced course work includes historically important works of literature and a survey of Iberian and Latin American history and culture. One semester studying abroad in a Spanish-speaking country is required to complete the Spanish major. Students also complete a capstone course their senior year, which includes proficiency evaluation and a service project with the local Hispanic community.

Transfer students should plan for five semesters in the Spanish program due to the requirement of study in a Spanish speaking country for one semester. However, these five semesters can be completed in two years if students decide to study abroad during the summer semester.

George Fox University Admission Information:

1. Transfer students interested in applying to George Fox University should submit an undergraduate application for admission. Applications may be found at apply.georgefox.edu, or request an application by calling 800-765-4369 x2240.
2. Regular decision dates for submitting a completed application
 - a. Fall Semester – March 1, Applications completed after this date will be considered only as space is available
 - b. Spring Semester – November 15
3. Transfer students need a college Grade Point Average (GPA) of a 2.6 or higher to be regularly admitted.
4. A maximum of 96 quarter or 64 semester hours will be accepted from community colleges.
 - a. Only course work with a grade of “C-” or better will be accepted
 - b. Courses must be 100-level or higher
 - i. 100/200 level courses will not be accepted for 300/400 level courses
 - c. One quarter credit = 2/3 semester credit
5. Junior standing is only achieved by transferring in a minimum of 93 transferable quarter credits. An Associate’s Degree does not automatically qualify a student to be a junior.
6. George Fox only accepts the Associated of Arts Oregon Transfer Degree (AAOT), the Washington Transfer Associates of Arts (WTAA), or any associates from California in which the student meets the IGETC requirements as meeting general education, excluding Bible/Religion requirements and any specific general education courses required by the major.
7. All majors are encouraged to refer to the George Fox University catalog. Transfer students are encouraged to complete major requirements at George Fox and general education requirements at the community college.
