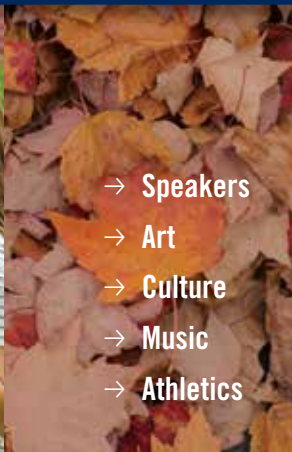

Ambassador Isom will give a public lecture on the exhibit on Monday, Oct. 8, at 6 p.m. A reception to open the exhibit follows at 7 p.m.

This exhibition will feature selections of photographs, art objects, and cultural artifacts representing the Dani people group of New Guinea, and the Taureg people of Niger. Harriet Isom was a career foreign service officer from 1961 to 1996, assigned to embassies in Asia and Africa. During her last decade in the Foreign Service, she served as U.S. ambassador to Laos, Benin and Cameroon. She grew up on her family ranch near Pendleton, Oregon.

**Dec. 10-14 Eden Wiegand - Senior Thesis Exhibit**

There will be an opening reception on Monday, Dec. 10, at 4 p.m.

Eden Wiegand presents her senior thesis exhibition, an investigation of animal portraiture and agrarian subject matter. Expressive and inventive color suggest playful and fanciful narrative in this exciting work.

Born in Oklahoma, Eden’s roots in a military family led her to embrace culture, place and location. She believes art should reflect the beauty and joy found in life. Eden is inspired by the Southwestern culture, humor and narrative. She has exhibited in local and regional art shows and has worked on commissions.
