Trauma Research Project	Curriculum Components (Certificate-seeking students take 4 units per block; 12 units total)	
Students earning the post-graduate certificate in trauma response services complete a trauma-informed research project. Students may begin the project after completing TRMA 500. Please visit with Anna Berardi early in your discernment process for steps you can take to keep the project practical and manageable while progressing through the TRI curriculum and degree program. The research project includes 3 of the 12 required certificate units.	Block A: Foundational Knowledge - TRMA 500, 501, 502, 503	Trauma-Informed foundational knowledge including nature of trauma, risk, resiliency, and best-practice frameworks for immediate & long term trauma response.
	Block B: Best-Practice Strategies - TRMA 560 (req'd for cert-seek. students), TRMA 540-549, 585	<i>When combined with Block A, practitioners build a strong perceptual and conceptual trauma-informed specialty.</i>
Trauma Research Project Sequence: TRMA 571 (I), 572 (II), 573 (III): See the catalog for complete details. Students begin the project in fall or spring, and continue until it is complete, registering for each course in numerical order.	Block C: Trauma Research & Leadership - TRMA 582; [571, 572, 573]	Practitioners demonstrate expertise through a trauma-informed research project, and a project-based leadership exercise.

The following schedule outlines the term, days, and week, and sometimes hour of day of that term when a TRMA course is *generally* offered; schedules can change so please verify offerings at least 1 term prior to taking a course. Additional electives not listed are also offered on a yearly basis.

Most TRMA courses are blended (50% online & 50% face to face - f2f), and will likely meet f2f for shorter time periods than indicated on the schedule. In some instances, f2f meetings may only occur on one of the two listed days. Each professor will post the actual f2f schedule at the beginning of that semester. Unless otherwise stated, all courses are 1-unit seminars, generally meeting 9am - 5pm for f2f class days.

Most courses are offered yearly. **Bi-yearly courses are noted in green type along with the years in which they are offered.** **Courses with required prerequisites or other anomalies are noted in red type.**

If a course overlaps with a GCEP course, contact the TRMA professor as often this can be accommodated due to the online elements of the course. With professor permission, you will be able to register despite this schedule overlap.

Find TRMA course schedules at class.georgefox.edu under “TRMA – Trauma Response Services” on the subject dropdown menu, not the general GCEP list.

- All TRMA courses are open to graduate students or post-graduate professionals in the mental health, ministerial, education, and health care disciplines.
- GSC students may use TRMA courses to fill elective requirements. TRMA courses may be double-counted as electives and to fulfill post-grad certificate requirements.
- Some Block B courses (for ex, *some* TRMA 585s; 543, 544) are profession-specific so have enrollment restrictions as noted on the University course schedule.
