#### **\$300,000 for Liberation Scholars at George Fox University** **Teagle Foundation**

*"Believing in the transformative power of liberal arts education and the joy that is to be found in engaging in humanities-based inquiry, I am thrilled to launch the Liberation Scholars Program for Latina/o high school students from Woodburn. Generously funded by the Teagle Foundation, the Liberation Scholars Program is a two-week immersive college experience in the summer followed by academic year meetings in which a team of George Fox faculty, staff, and students mentor the Liberation Scholars throughout the college application process, seeking to increase their college readiness. This meaningful and hope-giving work can widen the circle of people who engage in and pursue the humanities.
