COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Pam Fifer, EdD, MSN, RN, CNE Dean, College of Nursing; professor of nursing

Dr. Pamela Fifer has been the dean of the College of Nursing at George Fox University since 2017. A dedicated nurse for 33 years, Fifer brings extensive experience across diverse healthcare settings, including acute care, long-term care, and hospital administration.

Under her leadership, the College of Nursing has seen substantial growth. The undergraduate nursing program has doubled in size and is now one of the top three majors at George Fox. She has also been instrumental in developing graduate Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) programs during her tenure. Before serving as dean, Fifer spent 22 years in nursing education, holding both teaching and

administrative roles in associate degree and baccalaureate programs.

Fifer is highly committed to advancing the nursing profession through scholarship and service. Her research interests focus on nurse faculty development, student nurse success, and innovative teaching and learning practices. She has served as an item writer for national certification exams (NCSBN and NLN) and previously chaired the NLN Certification Board of Commissioners.

Her leadership extends beyond George Fox, as she currently serves as board president for the Oregon Center for Nursing and is a member of the prestigious National Advisory Council on Nursing Education and Practice (NACNEP).

Fifer's academic credentials include a bachelor's degree in nursing and a master of science in nursing from the University of Portland, as well as a doctor of education from George Fox University. She holds the recognized credential of Certified Nurse Educator (CNE).

Fifer and her husband, David, greatly enjoy spending time with their son and daughter-in-law, as well as their two granddaughters.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Academic regalia generally consist of cap, gown and hood worn on formal occasions at institutions of higher learning. It originated in the medieval period, when the vast majority of scholars were of the clergy. The gown evolved from what most likely was the clergy's robe. The gown was originally black, but color was introduced as institutions left ecclesiastical control. The bachelor's gown is worn closed and is distinguished by its pointed sleeves. A master's gown is designed to be worn closed with long, crescent-shaped sleeves. The doctor's garb may be worn open or closed with velvet panels down the front and three bars on the round, bell-shaped sleeves.

The most distinguishing feature of the academic attire is the hood. The hood originated as the skull cap worn by the clergy to protect their heads from the elements. The hood served a three-fold purpose: head covering, shoulder cap, and bag for alms. The size and shape of the hood designates not only the college degree of the wearer, but also the university he or she attended. The master's hood is three and one-half feet in length, while the doctor's hood is rounded and measures four feet in length. Hoods are lined with the official colors of the institution conferring the degree. The official colors of George Fox University are old gold and navy blue. The binding around the hood is velvet, with the color indicative of the major field of study.

The list of graduate names was provided to the printer several days prior to commencement to allow production of this program. The status of some candidates may have changed since that time. Some candidates will not have completed all requirements for their degrees; others not listed will have completed requirements. The listing of a name in this program does not obligate George Fox University to award a degree. For official purposes, a final corrected list of graduates will be retained by the Office of the Registrar.
