



## **Hazing Transparency Report**

The purpose of the George Fox University Anti-Hazing Policy is to prohibit hazing in all forms, ensure compliance with the Stop Campus Hazing Act (SCHA) Amendments to the Clery Act, and promote a safe and respectful campus environment.

The university publishes an annual hazing report that is sent to the Oregon Legislature. Additionally, in instances that are a violation of the Clery Act, incidents of hazing are recorded in the Annual Security Report.

In compliance with the SCHA, the University publishes this report of student organizations officially found responsible for hazing. The Hazing Transparency Report will provide key details: the organization's name, dates of the hazing, the disciplinary process timeline, and a description of the final findings. Investigations that did not establish responsibility for hazing are not included. This report is updated upon the finalization of outcomes and is shared with the campus twice per year on the [Campus Public Safety website](#).
