RESIDENCE LIFE STORAGE POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Storage Policies:

- Storage is subject to availability of space, and is available to those living on-campus next year.
- Students qualify for storage if they live further than 300 miles from campus.
- A maximum of **5 boxes**, each measuring a maximum of **2 feet by 2 feet by 2 feet**. Boxes made of plastic material, or suitcases, are recommended, although cardboard material will be accepted.
- All stored belongings must fit within one of a student's boxes or suitcases. The Area Coordinator must approve any items that cannot be boxed or put in suitcases.
- Bikes, mini-fridges, floor coverings, cinder blocks, and furniture are **not permitted** in storage rooms at any time.

Storage Procedures:

- Bring your boxes to the designated lobby (see table below); please note storage locations are based on where you will be living in the fall.
- Before unloading your items, please check with a Residence Life staff member in the lobby to ensure there is space in that location. If there is not space available, use an alternative location.
- A Residence Life staff member will give you campus storage labels to fill out and affix to each of your boxes with your name, home address, and date of graduation.
- You will place your items in storage. You can pick them up when you return in the fall.
- Eligible students may store items Monday Friday of finals week, from 8-10pm each night.
