Students must have earned a grade of B or better for a course to be considered for transfer. In addition, only courses taken elsewhere within 7 years of the date of matriculation to the Doctor of Psychology program will be considered for transfer. *The faculty will consider transfer requests and evaluate transcripts once students are admitted into the PsyD program*.
